This is the concluding statement on the positive part of the Sermon on the Mount.

Matthew 5:20

“For I (Jesus) say to you (personal) that unless (or, except, if not, a conditional phrase) your (personal) righteousness (or, a condition acceptable to God, justice, virtue, being as one ought to be. In both the OT and NT, righteousness is the state commanded by God and standing the test of His judgment. It is conformity to all that He commands or appoints) exceeds (what) the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees”

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“...exceeds (or, “shall abound still more”, to be in excess, overflowing. The statement is not merely comparative, but implies an abundance) the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, (the result of the condition) you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.”
