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Logos

Logos refers principally to the total inspired Word of God and to Jesus, who is the living Word. It is the totality, the entire of all that God is and says, and not the simple act of God speaking.

In Greek philosophy, it refers to the universal, divine reason or the mind of God.

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The word translated *filled* is a very strong and graphic word in the Greek and was originally applied to the feeding and fattening of animals in a stall.

The Sermon on the Mount

What does it mean to be filled with righteousness?

The word translated *filled* is a very strong and graphic word in the Greek and was originally applied to the feeding and fattening of animals in a stall.

It is expressing the complete satisfaction of spiritual hunger and thirst. Hence Wycliffe's rendering, *fulfilled*, is strictly true to the original meaning of the text.

That is the hunger of which the fourth beatitude speaks, the hunger for righteousness that only the Father can satisfy.

The Sermon on the Mount

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What does righteousness mean?

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This is not merely righteousness, but perfect righteousness. It is the righteousness of God.

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Literally God Himself.

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Genitive vs Accusative Nouns

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Blessed (*makários*) **are those** (not all) **who** (what) **hunger** (or, to be hungry, famished, starved) **and thirst** (or, to be dry) **for** (or, after) righteousness, (why) for they (those who hunger and thirst for righteousness) shall be filled (or, to fill up, to satisfy).
