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The king and his kingdom protect them from evil and harm both from within, and without, the kingdom.

My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father’s hand. I and My Father are one.”

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“I do not pray that You should take them out of the world (*kósmos*), but that You should keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world (*kósmos*), just as I am not of the world (*kósmos*). Sanctify (to make holy, clean, to render pure) them by Your truth. Your word is truth.”

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Honor and responsibility within the kingdom is granted by the king and is based on certain virtues.

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The Problem We Face

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In a word, Sanctification.

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Or, “Be holy, for I am holy” – 1 Peter 1:16

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The word *sanctification* is “a progressive work of God and man that makes us more and more free from sin and more like Christ in our actual lives.”

The Problem We Face

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The word is also translated, holiness.

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I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness (sanctification).

Romans 6:19

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But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness (sanctification), and the end, everlasting life.

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But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God—and righteousness and sanctification (holiness) and redemption.

1 Corinthians 1:30

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For this is the will of God, your sanctification (holiness): that you should abstain from sexual immorality; that each of you should know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification (holiness) and honor, not in passion of lust, like the Gentiles who do not know God.

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Pursue peace with (who) all people, and holiness (sanctification), without which (what) no one will see the Lord.

Hebrews 12:14

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For it is written:

“As I live, says the LORD, every knee shall bow to Me, and every tongue shall confess to God.” So then each of us shall give account of (who) himself to God.

Romans 14:11-12

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For we must all appear (where) before the judgment seat of Christ, (why) that each one (as individuals) may receive the things done (where) in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad (reward or loss of reward).
