Acts 1:1-2

The former account (*lógos*) I (Luke) made,
O Theophilus, (which was) of all that Jesus began both
to (1) do and (2) teach, until the day in which He was
taken up, after He (how) through the Holy Spirit had
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Note the nature of Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Acts 10:36-38

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“The word which God sent to the children of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus Christ— He is Lord of all— that word you know, (how) which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, and began from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: how God (Father) anointed Jesus of Nazareth with (1) the Holy Spirit and with (2) power (*dúnamis*), who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, (how) for God was with Him.”

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Acts 1:3

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to whom (*apóstolos* - sent-ones, messenger, delegate, ambassador) He also presented (to place or stand beside or near) Himself (what) alive (when) after His suffering (how) by many infallible proofs, (such as) being seen by (who) them (*apóstolos* - sent-ones, messenger, delegate, ambassador) during forty days and speaking of (what) the things pertaining to the kingdom of God.

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And He said to them, “It is not for you to know (1097) times (*chrónos* – a duration of time, the passing of moments) or seasons (period of opportunity) which the Father has put (placed, set) in His own authority (*exousía*). But you shall (future) receive (what is given or imparted) power (*dúnamis*) when (what) the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be (future) witnesses (one who has information or knowledge and can confirm something) to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”
