Wonders and Signs

Wonders (*téras*) are often associated with signs and are miracles or mighty works that are startling and imposing. Signs (*sēmeíon*) are wonders that attest to something greater than themselves, pointing to something else. These two words refer, not to different classes of miracles, but to different aspects of the same miracle, one kept as a lasting memory.

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Then they knew (*epiginōskō* – to know fully, to gain or receive complete knowledge, to know thoroughly) that it was he who sat begging alms at the Beautiful Gate of the temple; and they were filled with wonder (astonishment from admiration, to render immovable) and amazement (an ecstasy in which the mind is for a time carried, as it were, out of or beyond itself and lost, to remove out of its place, to be bewildered) at what had happened to him.
