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# The Holy Spirit in the Early Church

Now when they saw the boldness (freedom in speaking all that one thinks or pleases) of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated (without a letter of learning, uninstructed, illiterate) and untrained (*idiōtēs* – a common man opposed to a man of rank or education) men, they marveled (to be struck with admiration or astonishment). And they realized (to know fully) that they had been with Jesus.
