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And in the midst of this chapter we have the entire teaching on both human and divine love.

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The contrast is between their dependency on their former trade, their former way of life— or they could continue the ministry they were called to in the power and provision Jesus had always provided them.

It was time to choose.

# Human Weakness and Failure

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After these things Jesus showed (*phaneróō* - to make manifest or known what had been hidden, to expose, make visible, to show openly) Himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, and in this way He showed (*phaneróō*) Himself: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee (James and John), and two others of His disciples were together.
