“Therefore (based on what we’ve just seen) if you bring your gift to the altar (act of worship), and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled (denoting transition, to change one’s own feelings towards someone, to cause a state of peace between two people) to your brother, and then (after reconciliation) come and offer your gift.”

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To worship, our horizontal and vertical relationships

True Worship

What's the difference between worship and true worship?

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“These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me. And in vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.”

Matthew 15:8-9 (*Isaiah 29:13*)

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This type of worship amounts to nothing.

It's a vain repetition of religious acts or services that don't impact the heart nor worship God in the truth of who He is.

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What is true worship internally?

True Worship

What is true worship like internally?

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service (“spiritual worship” or acts of worship).

Spirit and Truth

“But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true (one who cannot lie, real, genuine, sincere) worshipers will worship the Father in spirit (human) and truth (reality, the essence of a matter); for the Father is seeking (to look for, search, strive to find) such to worship (to kiss, adore, fall or prostrate before, pay reverence) Him. God is Spirit (Holy Spirit), and those who worship Him must (what must be done from duty) worship in spirit (human) and truth.”

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We focus on the externals.

God is more concerned with the heart.

Spirit and Truth

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“When we worship— right worship, good worship, pleasing worship— depends on a right mental grasp of the way God really is, truth. If we worship an idol of our own creation, we are not really worshiping God. And secondly, worship depends on a right spiritual or emotional or affectional heart grasp of God’s supreme value. So true worship is based on a right understanding of God’s nature and it is a right valuing of God’s worth.”

John Piper

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In order to worship the Father in “spirit and truth” we must know the “truth” of God and about God and express our adoration, love, and supreme value of that “truth” from our inner being, our “spirit.”

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Worship must have a heart and a head.

Worship must engage both emotions and thought.

Spirit and Truth

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Nicodemus said to Him, “How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother’s womb and be born?”

Jesus answered, “Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit (Holy Spirit), he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit (Holy Spirit) is spirit (human).”

Worship must come from your regenerated spirit.

Spirit and Truth

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“Truth without emotion produces dead orthodoxy and a church full (or half-full) of artificial admirers (like people who write generic anniversary cards for a living). On the other hand, emotion without truth produces empty frenzy and cultivates shallow people who refuse the discipline of rigorous thought. But true worship comes from people who are deeply emotional and who love deep and sound doctrine. Strong affections for God rooted in truth are the bone and marrow of biblical worship.”
