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The first (*baptizō*) means “to submerge, to immerse, to dip as into dye.”

The second (*báptisma*), which is used more often, is a stronger word that means “to submerge totally, to immerse completely, to drown, to dunk into water.”

What is Baptism?

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In fact, since baptism became a technical term for immersion it was transliterated rather than translated

Also, it is never used in the passive sense. Water is never said to be baptized on someone. It is always someone being baptized into water.

What Does Baptism Mean?

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For you are all sons of God (how) through faith in Christ Jesus. solidarity with Christ, is what now saves us.
