“**He who has an ear**, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes I will give to eat from the tree of life, which is in the midst of the Paradise of God.”

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Note the order: the promise to the overcomer is after the closing statement.

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This time frame runs from the birth of the church until the turn of the first century, 30 AD to 100 AD.
