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Romans 1:16-17

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For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, (why) for it is the power (*dynamis*) of God to salvation for (who) everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it (the gospel of Christ) the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, “The just shall live by faith.”

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The gospel of Christ is found in 1 Corinthians 15:1-4.

Romans 1:18-19

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For (what) the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against (what) all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, (who do what) who suppress the truth (how) in unrighteousness, (why) because what may be known of God is manifest (where) in them, (how) for God has shown (past tense) it to them.

Romans 1:20-21

For since (when) the creation of the world (what) His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, (to what extent) even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they (those under His wrath) are without excuse, (why) because, although they knew (*ginōskō*) God, they (those who knew God) did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile (foolish, stupid) in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

Likewise (in the same way) also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust (desire, appetite, longing) for one another, men with men committing what is shameful (indecent, obscene), and receiving (where) in themselves (what) the penalty of their error which was due.

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50% of these infections occur in young people from ages 15-24.

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Step Three: Depraved Mind

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And even as they did not like (to test, try, approve, to discern, recognize as genuine) to retain (implied continual possession) God (where) in their knowledge (*epígnōsis*), (what) God gave them over to (what) a debased (reprobate, unworthy, worthless, rejected, ignoble) mind, (result) to do those things which are not fitting;

Therefore you are inexcusable (without defense or apology), O man, whoever you are who (what) judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; (how) for you who judge practice the same things. But we know that the judgment of God is according to truth against those who practice such things.

eternal life to those who by (what) patient continuance (steadfastness, perseverance, endurance, to remain under or bearing up under) in (what) doing good seek for (strive to find) glory, honor, and immortality; but to those who are self-seeking (contentious) and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness— indignation (anger to the point of boiling) and wrath,

tribulation and anguish, on (who) every soul of man who does evil, of the Jew first and also of the Greek; but glory, honor, and peace to everyone who (what) works what is good, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For there is no partiality with God.

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
