# Salvation from God's Perspective

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It is the difference between light and darkness.

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For example, the woman at the well, the prodigal son, Zacchaeus, the 3,000 on Pentecost, Cornelius, Paul, Lydia, the Philippian jailor, the Ethiopian eunuch, and so many more, including you and me, supposedly.

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But we know what we are like on the inside.

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And if not, are we deceived?

# The Order of Salvation

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## 1. Election

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2. The Effectual Call  
(God speaks powerfully to us via the Gospel)

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## 6. Adoption

(becoming His child, being part of His family)

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(remaining a Christian, our security in Him)

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So where does the deception come in?

At regeneration.

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Let me explain.

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There are many Scriptures that speak of a spiritual interaction between our spirit and the Holy Spirit.

So the question would be:

Have you had this kind of interaction with the Spirit?

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The Spirit (emphatic) Himself (what) bears witness (*summaturéō* – to testify, to witness, to confirm, to provide supporting evidence) with our spirit (human spirit) that we are children of God.

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Has the Spirit confirmed that to you?

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Has the Spirit confirmed that to you? If so, how?

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And what was the result of His confirmation?

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And what was the result of His confirmation?

How has that experience, Spirit to spirit, changed your life from that point until today?

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If His confirmation of your sonship hasn't changed your life, Spirit to spirit, should it have?

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Can you see where deception could creep in?

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For everything, all salvation,  
begins and ends with regeneration.

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Which is why we are commanded to take stock of our spiritual life to determine if we are, in fact, saved.

This is to determine if regeneration truly took place.

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Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith.

Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves,  
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2 Corinthians 13:5

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What does this command and warning mean?

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What does this command and warning mean?

And why is it so important?

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And then the all-important internal question each believer must ask of themselves.

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Do you not know (*epiginōskō* – to know fully by experience, to gain or receive full knowledge of something, to know all there is to know about something) yourselves (emphatic), that (what) Jesus Christ is in you?— unless (why you wouldn't know) indeed you are disqualified (*adókimos* – fraudulent, unapproved, unworthy, spurious, worthless, corrupted).

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Unless you are deceived into thinking you are saved.

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Would others be able to see the change He makes?

And what does it mean if they can't see anything?

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And make sure of your salvation today.
