How to Grow Your Faith

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First, like everything else in life, faith must be tested.

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And testing usually comes during trials
and tribulations.

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My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, (why) knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let (or don't quit or give up early in the process) patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.

James 1:2-4

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But what does this mean?

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My brethren, count (reckon, consider, live like it was true) it all joy when you fall (to fall into the midst of something as to be totally surrounded by it) into various trials (temptations, a putting to the test),

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Note, when God brings His people through trials and adversity it is to encourage them to trust Him more.

When Satan is the agent of temptations, it is for the purpose of making one fall.

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(why) knowing (*ginōskō*) that the testing of your faith produces (to finish, accomplish, to bring to a desired end) patience (to persevere, to remain under, to endure). But let (or don't quit or give up early in the process) patience have its perfect (complete, full, wanting in nothing) work, that you may be perfect (complete, full, wanting in nothing) and complete (whole, having all its parts), lacking nothing.

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Find five promises and live as if you believe them.

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Five promises, some conditional, some not, and then align your life to them as if your life depended on them being true (which it does).

Let's see our five promises for this week.

Let's see what each of these say.

James 1:5-8

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If any of you lacks wisdom, (then) let him ask of God, (promise) who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. But (condition) let him ask in faith, (meaning) with no doubting, (why) for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind.

For (result) let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; (why) he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

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Focus on the phrase “whatever you do”
