# Convergence

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“The act of converging and especially moving toward union or uniformity (single point or focus).”

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In other words, to move towards an end goal (point and focus) with ever increasing intensity and speed.

This is exactly what Jesus told us to look out for.

It's a description of a woman in labor.

# Convergence

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And Jesus answered and said to them:

“Take heed that no one deceives you. For many will come in My name, saying, ‘I am the Christ,’ and will deceive many. And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not troubled; for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.”

# Convergence

# The Condition of the Church

Lewis Sperry Chafer (1871-1952)

“A very extensive body of Scripture bears on the last days for the Church. Reference is to a restricted time at the very end of, and yet wholly within, the present age. Though this brief period immediately precedes the great tribulation and in some measure is a preparation for it, these two times of apostasy and confusion— though incomparable in history— are wholly separate the one from the other.”

# The Condition of the Church

“Those Scriptures which set forth the last days for the Church give no consideration to political or world conditions but are confined to the Church itself. These Scriptures picture men as departing from the faith. There will be a manifestation of characteristics which belong to unregenerate men, though it is under the profession of "a form of godliness.”

# The Condition of the Church

“The indication is that, having denied the power of the blood of Christ, the leaders in these forms of righteousness will be unregenerate men from whom nothing more spiritual than this could proceed.”



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In essence, the bulk of church leaders in the last days will be unregenerate (lost) men who exhibit a form of godliness but have no power of Christ within them.
